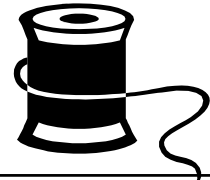

## **DID YOU KNOW?**

The BHQG had their first quilt show in the KC Hall in 1977. Admission was 75 cents. 130 quilts were displayed and 400 people were in attendance. The raffle quilt ticket sales were \$360.00 (records don't indicated what the price of tickets were – does anyone remember?)
