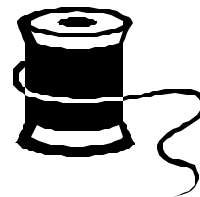

PROJECT WARMTH

We closed out the year by giving away 302 quilts; extra busy the last week of June. Children's Home- 6; Fire/flood- 8; Habitat for Humanity- 5; Pediatrics- 156; WAVI- 20; Youth & Family Services- 76; Special Request- 31. Special Request includes 29 quilts sent to Dupree to help the victims of the Manor which houses single mothers/children & elders. Of course I can only do this once in awhile or I run out of finished quilts. PW doesn't need more quilt tops, we need tops quilted. I am now short of cot-size and twin/full -size.

Sales were down at the Quilt Show but PW still made over \$2000, which should carry us along another year. We did not use any Guild money this past year and hopefully won't need any this coming year (if the good Lord's willing and the creek don't rise!)

July's Work Day, the 26th will be dedicated to kid quilt tops. PW got a donation of Wizard of Oz material and Jetson material. Come with ideas on how to use this largesse. Pot luck of course!!!

I appreciate all that you members do for Project Warmth. If it wasn't for you PW wouldn't exist. Thanks again!!!
