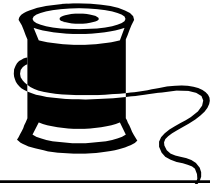

CALL FOR ENTRIES!

QUILTS, WEARABLE QUILTS

Quilt/Decorative painting show at the Journey, starting June 1 through August 10.

We are looking for quilts to be considered for a show at the Journey which will start two weeks before the Quilt Show and run until the Rally show--most of the summer. We are interested in quilts with a seasonal theme or colors (winter, spring, summer, fall) and also in wearable art, vests jackets, purses and bags.

We are asking for items that might have been in past quilt shows or others but not anything that you planned to put into this year's quilt show. Please contact Judy Haas or Vicki Gose for further information or to leave a quilt for consideration for display.

"Consideration" means how well the quilt will coordinate and enhance the displays that will include the decorative paintings. Large and small quilts will be considered. Because of the hanging methods at the Journey the quilts will need a sleeve. Quilts and photos of quilts can be left with Joan Hunter at the Journey or given to one of the committee members listed below. Deadline is May 19.

Project Warmth will hold a work day the end of July to showcase that project and how the guild works in the community. Several daytime QG meetings will be at the Journey during the show --those dates are yet to be determined.

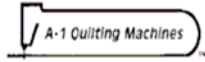
